

## Aston Martin Is Making a Motorcycle that Costs [Eyes Explode]

It's the first-ever bike from the British carmaker. And it costs [does burnout on a pile of money].

Today Aston Martin, maker of beautiful cars for people who have serious opinions on yachts, showed off its first ever motorcycle. Dubbed the AMB 001, it...well, it costs \$119,559. That's the most important thing to know. The least expensive Aston Martin car, the Vantage, starts at \$152,820, which sounds like a goddamn steal when you consider that it comes with two more wheels, a roof, another seat, and the option of wearing an entirely leather outfit rather than the requirement.

Only 100 AMB 001 bikes will be made, so that partially explains the price. So, too, do the details. Like the 180-horsepower turbocharged V-twin engine—an absolutely overkill amount of power to put down on a public road, which is why the AMB 001 is track-legal only. That's not a problem, because if you have AMB 001 money, you either have access to a racetrack or the ability to get local department of transportation laws overturned in your favour.

Everywhere you look at the AMB 001, it's carbon fibre, titanium, and billet aluminium (a.k.a., the fancy aluminium), with design cues pulled from Aston's cars. Squint just right and the shape of the tank mimics a key body line on the Vantage. The seat—or as Aston calls it, the "saddle"—is crafted from hand-stitched Oxford Tan leather.



Because your ass deserves hand-sewn leather.

The front fairing features winglets to keep the rider from flying off into the atmosphere, and the titanium ridge bisecting the tank lets everyone know which edition out of 100 they're staring at.



Collect 'em all!

The whole deal is hand-assembled in France by Brough Superior, a revived boutique motorcycle builder from the turn of the (20th) century. It even says so, right there on the engine:



This is where the engine inhales.

Lucky AMB 001 buyers will take delivery at the tail end of 2020, so for now they'll have to sate themselves with these photos, and also all the other cool, beautiful, rare things they own.

# SAROLEA 1947 S6 SUPERSPORT 589 CC 1 CYL OHV




Sarolea 1947 589 cc OHV "47 S- 6 Supersport"

From 1930 on the Saroléa type numbering system changes in that the type number starts with the model year, so the 47 S is model S of 1947. That's the 500cc OHV, the extension -6 refers to the 600cc model and this S6 is the top model in the 1947 Saroléa range. The firm introduces the sloping engine for their 1931 model range. Many factories then design machines with forward leaning engines for several reasons: from a technical point of view the machines can be built lower, so the road holding improves. The accessibility of the cylinder head also gets better in many cases. But the esthetical approach is also important: many machines look so much better with an inclined engine. The sturdy and sporty 589cc engine has bore x stroke of 88x97mm. The machine weighs 145 kg and has a top speed of about 120 km/h. The oil is carried in an extension of the crankcase and the duplex primary chain runs in an oil bath. This well restored machine is equipped with Bosch ignition and electric lighting, 4-speed foot-operated gearbox, Brown rubber saddle and Amal carburettor. Accessories include VDO speedometer and rear view mirror.













The cop is shocked and surprised that the man has admitted this so freely. He says, "So you're telling me you were speeding...AND committed a robbery?"


"Oh yes," replies the man calmly. "I have all the loot in the back."
